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The first question of Fatwa no. (6384):

**Q 1: Can a person make Tawassul (supplicating to Allah through an intermediary) through the Qur'an and particular days, such as saying, "O, Allah! I supplicate to you by the honor of the Day of 'Arafah" and so on?**

**A:** It is permissible to make Tawassul through the Qur'an, because it is the word of Allah in meaning and form. His Words are part of His Attributes, so it is considered Tawassul to Allah through one of His Attributes which does not contradict with Tawhid (monotheism) or lead to Shirk (associating others with Allah in worship). As for Tawassul through a particular day, it is impermissible, because it is Tawassul through a creature, so it is a means leading to Shirk. This contradicts with the evidence of Shari'ah, such as the saying of the Prophet (peace be upon him), [\(Whoever performs any act for which there is no sanction from us, it is to be rejected.\)](#) Narrated by [Muslim](#) in his Sahih (authentic) Book of Hadith.
